# **TALK & LISTEN**

- Encourage open conversations about their day, friendships, and worries
  Let them know they can always come to you—
- no matter what.



#### **STAY SAFE ONLINE**

- · Set parental controls on devices
- Know their apps, games, and who they're talking to online. Teach tnem to never share personal



### KNOW THEIR WORLD

- Know where your child is, who they're with, and what they're doing
  Keep contact details for friends' parents and schools



### **SPOT THE SIGNS**

- Watch for changes in mood, behaviour, or secrecy
  Trust your instincts—if something feels off, ask

#### **TEACH BOUNDARIES**

- Help children understand safe vs unsafe touch
- · Use age-appropriate language to talk about consent
